## Notice of Intent of City of Lewis to Fill City Council Vacancy by **Special Election**

Cass County Auditor and Commissioner of Elections Kathy Somers hereby notifies residents of the City of Lewis that the city clerk has received a valid petition requesting a special election to fill the vacancy of the at-large council seat. The vacancy was created following Christopher Jahnke's election as mayor on April 29, 2025. The term for this seat will expire December 31, 2025. The seat will also be on the ballot during the regular City/School Election on November 4, 2025.

The special election will be held August 19, 2025 at the Lewis Community Center.

Prospective candidates must file an Affidavit of Candidacy and Nomination Petition with a minimum of 10 signatures from eligible Lewis voters with the Cass County Auditor's office no later than 5:00 PM on Friday, July 25, 2025. Nomination papers are available in the auditor's office in the Cass County Courthouse.

Any candidate who wishes to withdraw from the election after filing may do so by submitting a written notice of withdrawal to the auditor's office by Monday, July 28, 2025.

Joey followed with a single and, after a successful steal, the Tigers had runners at second and third. Sadie Gohlinghorst dropped a single into shallow right to score Keeley, and another run came home on an Underwood error, extending the lead to 4-0. In the fifth, Ailey drilled a leadoff single off the left field fence, and her courtesy runner

Brystol Wyman stole second. With two outs, Keeley collected her third hit of the night, moving Brystol to third. Keeley then stole second, and Daphna delivered again, smacking a two-run single to left center to make it 6–0. Underwood pushed back in the sixth, scoring two runs on a pair of singles, two walks, and a Tiger error, narrowing the gap to 6–2. But the Tigers defense regrouped and shut the door in the seventh to seal the win. With the win, the Tigers moved on to the regional semifinal on Friday, July 11.

Ailey Wahlert took the circle for the Tigers, allowing just 1 earned run on 2 hits while striking out 3 and walking 8. Offensively, the Tigers were steady and effective, getting their leadoff batter on base in every inning to keep constant pressure on Underwood's defense. Keeley Kinney led the way at the plate, going a perfect 3-for-3 with a double, one RBI, and three runs scored. Marissa Askeland followed closely behind, finishing 3-for-4 — and making history in the process. With her 3 hits in the game, Marissa broke the school record for career hits, surpassing the previous record of 136. After this game, Marissa has 138 career hits! Daphna Wahlert also had a strong performance, going 2-for-3 with 3 RBIs. Ailey Wahlert, Joey Reynolds, and Sadie Gohlinghorst each added a hit, with Joey scoring once and Sadie driving in a run. Courtney Follmann and Brystol Wyman also crossed the plate to contribute to the Tigers' win.
