Foster Home for Handicapped Children: institution An providing sleeping and living accommodations for the fulltime care, training, recreation, and convalescent needs of not more than eight (8) physically or mentally handicapped persons under the age of nineteen (19).

SECTION 2. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby

repealed. **SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY** CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged to be invalid unconstitutional, adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudicated invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.


