Monona Council approves Center Street improvement project

MONONA – Center Street in Monona will see significant improvements later this year after the Monona City Council approved a Resolution to use funding on the project.

The Council approved plans and specifications for the project before awarding a contract for it to Bacon Concrete of Postville

for \$570,756.45. The bid was one of five received for the project and came in more than \$91,000 below the engineer's estimated cost.

Approval for the project came after the Council approved a resolution for a General Obligation Corporate Purpose Loan Agreement not to exceed \$1 million. There were no written or oral comments filed during a public

hearing on the project.

In other business, the Council approved a \$1,265.13 bid from Roger's Lock & Key/Kregal Electric to re-key the police station. It also asked City Administrator Barb Collins to contact the contractor who installed the library roof and have them look at it while also contacting a contractor to get a quote for spray foaming.

The Council approved a quote from EMC to renew the city's insurance policy. The renewal comes with a 7 percent rate increase and allows the city to make monthly payments rather than needing to pay the entire premium in April.
