MINUTES

FLOYD COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING MARCH 9, 2026, 5:00 P.M.

The Floyd County Board of Supervisors met in the Floyd County Emergency Operation Room (EOC). Supervisors Gloria Carr, Boyd Campbell, and Frank Rottinghaus were in attendance for a joint meeting with members of the 911 Service Board, Emergency Management Commission, and the Communications Advisory Board.

Also in attendance, in person or via Teams, were Emergency Management Commissioners: Sheriff Jeff Crooks, Supv Campbell, City Mayors-Charlie Newman (Floyd), Jeff Buland (Rudd), Jerry Engelhardt (Marble Rock), Scott Johnson (Rockford), and Shelly Weiss (Nashua). 911 Service Board members: City of Floyd Representative -Ben Chatfield, Supv Campbell, Sheriff Crooks, City Mayors, Dougherty Mayor Lynn Nagel, City of Colwell Representative Lon Isakson, City of Charles City Representative Sam Deverell, and Emergency Management Coordinator Jason Webster. Communications Advisory Board: Supv Rottinghaus, Sheriff Crooks, Charles City Chief of Police Hugh Anderson, Charles City Fire Chief Sam Deverell, and Dispatch Supervisor John Gohr. Others present were County Attorney Todd Prichard, County Auditor Morrigan Montagne, Marble Rock Fire Chief Brian Chambers, County employees Jessy Willadsen and Al Schwickerath, and media Bob Steensen and Van Mitchell.

Rottinghaus/Carr moved to approve the agenda. Motion carried 2-0. Emergency Management Commission: Engelhardt/Johnson moved to approve the agenda. Motion carried 7-0. 911 Service Board: Nagel/Engelhardt moved to approve the agenda. Motion carried 11-0. Communications Advisory Board: Hugh/Crooks moved to approve the agenda. Motion carried 5-0. Supv Campbell arrived.

The Boards discussed transferring duties from the Floyd County 911 Service Board to Floyd County Emergency Management. 911 Service Board: Crooks/Deverell moved to amend the board under Section 11 of the bylaws and vote at the May 7th 911 Service Board meeting. Motion carried 11-0. Emergency Management Commission: Engelhardt/ Newman moved to assume 911 Service Board duties under the Emergency Management Commission. Motion carried 7-0.

The Boards discussed the transfer of 911 Coordinator duties, including the Emergency Management Commission assuming responsibility for 911 operations. Engelhardt/ Johnson moved to allow Jason Webster to assume the role of 911 Coordinator. Motion carried 7-0. Campbell/ Rottinghaus moved to increase Webster's annual salary by \$18,330 upon assuming the 911 Coordinator duties effective March 9, 2026. Motion carried 3-0.

The Boards discussed the transition of oversight of the Dispatch Department from the Board of Supervisors to Emergency Manage-

ment. Emergency Management Commission: Engelhardt/Johnson moved to approve Webster overseeing Dispatch. Motion carried 7-0. Rottinghaus/Campbell moved to transition Webster's duties to include oversight of Dispatch. Motion carried 3-0. The Boards discussed the future of the Communications Advisory Board (28E), including whether there is a need for the board to continue or be reconfigured and whether membership should be expanded. Chatfield and Webster will reach out to additional entities regarding participation on the Communications Advisory Board. At the next meeting, a revised 28E agreement reflecting any changes will be drafted for consideration.

Rottinghaus/Campbell moved to adjourn the meeting at 6 p.m. Motion carried 3-0. Emergency Management Commission: Newman/ Engelhardt moved to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 7-0. 911 Service Board: Deverell/Crooks moved to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 11-0. Communications Advisory Board: Crooks/Anderson moved to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 5-0.

Motion by Abell seconded by Hinrichsen to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Public comments to the Board: Derek Steere handed the Board community signatures in favor of a superintendent candidate, Tod Wulff offered his opinion regarding the possibility of whole-grade sharing in the future, Kristi Reinke and Craig Reinke asked about basketball and football programs for next year.

Elementary Principal Hoffman reported on upcoming RRRM Elementary Math and Literacy Nights. Math Night is scheduled for March

30, with grades K-2 from 5:30-6:15 PM, followed by supper for grades K-6 from 6:15-6:45 PM, and grades 3-6 from 6:45-7:30 PM. Literacy Night will be held April 14 with the same schedule. Both events will take place in the Multi-Purpose Room.

High School Principal Johnson reported that students in grades 9-12 are currently enrolled in 116 NIACC courses. Spring sports practices have begun, and the FFA Banquet is scheduled for March 28 at 5:00 PM. Mr. Johnson also reviewed the cell phone policy, noting its successful implementation.

Superintendent Kasper provided a legislative update, noting that the state has approved a 2% supplemental state aid increase for Iowa schools.

Motion by Hinrichsen seconded by Abell to approve the consent agenda. Motion carried unanimously. The consent agenda included minutes from the February 18, 2026 regular board meeting and the March 4, 2026 work session. Resignations included Mercedes Wolf as Para Professional. Staff Contracts included Travis Pike as Junior High Track Coach and Kylie Brokel as Volunteer Softball Coach. Open enrollments included 3 students in from Charles City, 1 student in from North Butler, 2 students out to North Butler, 2 students out to Saint Ansgar, 2 students out to Mason City and 7 students out to Osage. The Kids Heart Challenge Fundraiser was also approved.

Motion by Abell seconded by Hinrichsen to approve the bills and financial reports. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Abell seconded by Brokel to approve the termination of the Human Resources shared services agreement with the Gar-

ner-Hayfield-Ventura Community School District and direct the administration to provide the required notice in accordance with the terms of the agreement. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Hinrichsen seconded by Stevens to approve the first reading of the 600 series as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Abell seconded by Hinrichsen to approve Board Policy 104- Anti-Bullying/Harassment Investigation Policy. This policy is updated yearly. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Stevens seconded by Hinrichsen to approve the FY27 Iowa Local Government Risk Pool Participation Agreement as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Brokel seconded by Abell to approve the Services Agreement and License with RelayHub, LLC. Motion carried unanimously.

ROCKFORD CITY COUNCIL PUBLIC HEARING MARCH 10, 2026 & REGULAR MEETING 7:30 P.M.

1. The Rockford City Council met in regular session at the Rockford City Hall on Tuesday, March 10, 2026. Mayor Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M. Present were Council Members Enabnit, Schlader, Johnson, Pearson, and Seibert. Also present were citizen Bill Dow, Frank Kelly with Heartland and employee Daniel Paulus.

Motion Enabnit, sec. Johnson to approve the agenda as posted. Passed all ayes roll call vote.

2. Motion Schlader, sec. Seibert to open Public Hearing at 7:31 P.M. for bids received for the 2026 Street Asphalt Project as published. Passed all ayes roll call vote. Mayor Johnson asked for any written or oral objections or comments: there being none, Motion Seibert, sec. Enabnit to close Public Hearing at 7:32 P.M.

3. Motion Enabnit, sec. Johnson to approve bid from Heartland Asphalt for the 2026 Asphalt Project for \$171,713.00. Passed with the following roll call vote: Ayes: Johnson, Pearson, Seibert, Enabnit, and Schlader.

4. Motion Schlader, sec. Johnson to approve the consent agenda consisting of February 10, 2026 Council Minutes, Monthly Reports, Claims and Expenses. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.

5. Motion Enabnit, sec. Seibert approved to install a storm sewer at the west end of Riverview Drive with Neil Fullerton Excavating for no more than \$8,600.00 to be paid after July 1, 2026. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.

6. Motion Johnson, sec. Schlader to approve the replacement of water main at 2nd Ave NW & 7th St NW with Neil Fullerton Excavating for no more than \$29,000.00 to be paid after July 1, 2026. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.

7. Sidewalk removal at 110 5th St NW was tabled until next meeting.

8. Discussion with held with the council on the responses that have been received so far from the park survey.

9. Motion Johnson, sec. Enabnit to approve donation of \$250.00 to the RRRM After Prom. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.

10. Motion Johnson, sec. Schlader to approve donation of \$200.00 to the Easter Egg Hunt that will take place on April 4th, 2026 at the Rockford Fossil Park. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.

11. Motion Schlader, sec. Enabnit to approve donation of \$2,000.00 to the RRRM Summer Recreation. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.

12. Motion Enabnit, sec. Seibert to approve bid from Larry Pump, CPA of \$3,400.00 for the City of Rockford annual exam ending June 30, 2026. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.

13. Mayor Johnson discussed with the council the settlement that Herbert Malarkey Roofing Company is reimbursing the city for the faulty shingles that were installed on the City Hall roof. In discussion the council would like to get quotes on a few different options to replace roof from the original contractor who did the City Hall Roof Project, Troy Losee Construction, Inc. Item will be placed on next meeting.

14. Public Works Employee Daniel Paulus reported on snow removal work done on the open shelter at West Park, city hall roof, and their plans on the rest of ash tree removal on city property.

15. Mayor Johnson reported on meetings with the county and that the EMA & 911 Board will be consolidating. He also talked with the council about the RRRM School District enrollment issues and asked for any suggestions or ideas on how we as community can help support the school.
