**SAC COUNTY SUPERVISORS  
MARCH 17, 2026 - BOARD ROOM 10:00AM**

The Sac County Board of Supervisors met in regular session with all members present with Jim Wissler, Chairman, presiding. The minutes of the last meeting were approved as submitted.

It was moved by Fischer and seconded by Drake to approve the minutes of the last meeting as submitted. Ayes all, motion carried.

It was moved by Drake and seconded by Fischer to approve the purchase of a Zenix Monitor/Defibrillator, EMS, Fire Configuration from Zoll Medical Corporation for \$58,238.81, using funds from the Sac County Opioid Settlement funds. Ayes all, motion carried.

Brian Blomme, Sac County Drainage Engineer introduced Alex Logan, Conservation Agronomist, who explained a batch and build bioreactor project for Sac County. The project will be funded through the Iowa Soybean Association.

It was moved by Fischer and seconded by Drake to adopt Resolution 2026-03-17, approving the transfers of \$473,000.50 from Rural Basic fund to Secondary Road fund and \$44,860.50 from General Basic fund to Secondary Road fund. Ayes Drake, Fischer, Wissler; nays none, motion carried.

It was moved by Drake and seconded by Fischer to approve the claims as listed on the claims register in the Auditor's office. Ayes all, motion carried.

Sac County Attorney Ben Smith presented a 28E agreement establishing a multi county attorney office in and for Calhoun, Greene and Sac Counties. After some discussion, it was moved by Drake and seconded by Fischer to adopt Resolution 2026-028, approving the establishment of a Multicounty County Attorney Office in and for Calhoun County, Greene County and Sac County. Ayes Drake, Fischer, Wissler; nays none, motion carried.

There was no report from the County Engineer.  
With there being no further business, on motion, the meeting was adjourned.

succeed her. For the Republicans, Randy Feenstra, the current U.S. Representative for Iowa District 4, is among five candidates seeking that party's nomination. Other candidates include: Eddie Andrews of Johnston; Zach Lahn of Belle Plaine; Brad Sherman of Williamsburg; and Adam Steen of Runnels.

Only one candidate filed for governor in the Democratic primary, current Auditor of State Rob Sand of Des Moines.

In the Secretary of State primary, only incumbent Republican Paul Pate of Cedar Rapids and Democrat Ryan Peterman of Davenport are seeking their party's nomination.

With Auditor Rob Sands' attempt for the governor's office leaving an opening there, the Democrats have Taylor Wettach of Muscatine seeking that office, while the Republicans have two candidate in the primary, current Lt. Governor Chris Cournoyer of LeClaire and Abigail Maas of Williamsburg.

For Treasurer of State, incumbent Republican Roby Smith of Davenport is unopposed for that party, and the Democrats have John Norwood of West Des Moines seeking their nomination.

Republican Secretary of Agriculture Mike Naig is unopposed in the Republican primary. The Democrats have Chris Jones of Iowa City running for their nomination.

Republican Brenna Bird of Dexter is unopposed in her re-election bid for Attorney General. The Democrats will have Nate Willems of Mount Vernon on their primary ballot.

There will most likely be a rematch in November for the State Representative District 7 seat that was just filled last December. Wendy Larson of Odebolt, now the incumbent, will be on the Republican ballot in the primary, unopposed. For the Democrats, Rachel Burns of rural Odebolt will be on their primary ballot. Both candidates ran in the special election as their party's candidate last November to fill a vacancy following the resignation of Mike Sexton, a Republican from Rockwell City who took a job in federal government.

Federal Offices  
Both the Republicans and

Democrats have two candidates seeking their party's nomination for the U.S. Senate seat this fall. Current Senator Joni Ernst is not seeking re-election.

For the Republicans, Ashley Hinson, the current U.S. Representative District 2 holder, is seeking to move to the Senate. She will be challenged by Jim Carlin of Sioux City, a former state legislator.

The Democrats will choose between two current state legislators for their Senate candidate: Josh Turek of Council Bluffs and Zach Wahls of Coralville.

With current District 4 Congressman Randy Feenstra seeking the governor's office, both parties have new faces seeking the Iowa District 4 seat in the U.S. House of Representatives. The Republicans have just one candidate in the primary, Chris McGowan of Sioux City. Democrats will choose from three candidates: Dave Dawson of Lawton; Stephanie Steiner of Sutherland; and Ashley WolfTornabane of Storm Lake.

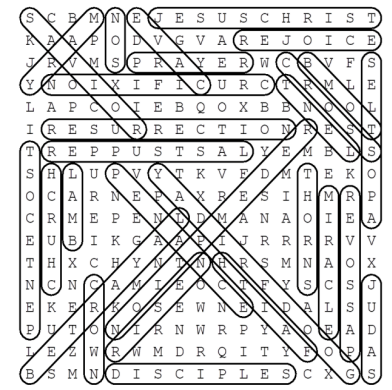
The primary election for both Republicans and Democrats will be held on Tuesday, June 2. Winners will appear on the ballot as their party's nominee in the November 3 election. There is a possibility that some offices with more than two candidates in

the primary could not receive the necessary threshold of 35 percent of the vote; in that situation, their party will determine their candidate at a party convention.
