Minutes of the Regular Meeting
East Sac County Community School District Board of Education
March 16, 2026

The public hearing on the Instruction Support Levy was called to order by president Mahler at 6:00 PM in the High School Library. No public comments had been heard from the board. Jansma moved to adjourn the public hearing, Wallace seconded; motion carried 5-0.
