2025 Weather Approaches Local Average Amounts

Thanks to explicit records kept by local weather reporters, Don Schwartz of Bayard and Craig Cogil of Jamaica, the precipitation collected in 2025 was much closer to normal.

Schwartz has records going back 19 years while Cogil has information for 20 years. They have experienced both highs and lows of rain and snowfall.

Schwartz measured 32.5 inches of precipitation in 2025. His 19-year average is 39.186 inches. He caught a high of 64.45 inches in 2015 and a low of 17.3 in 2020.
