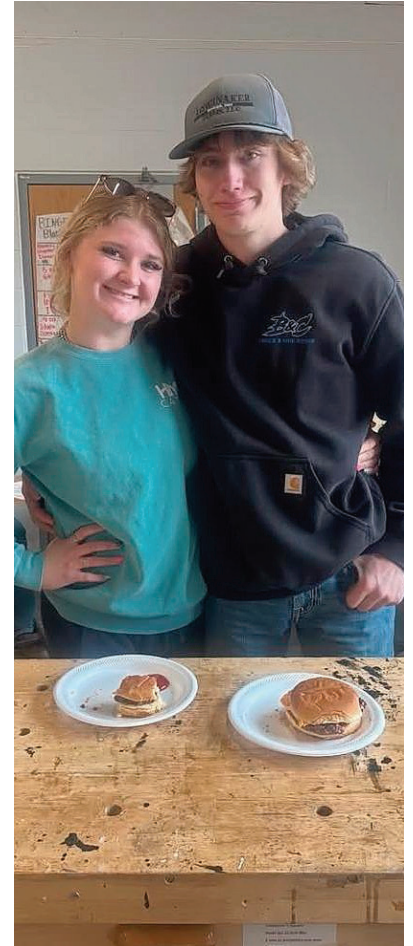

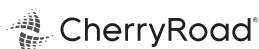

Rural Development invests \$5.2 million in Iowa water resources

U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development Iowa State Director Mike Sexton has announced that the agency is investing \$5,273,000 across three projects that will safeguard clean water and improve wastewater systems in rural Iowa communities.

Projects include a \$442,000 loan to the City of Randolph through the Water and Waste Disposal Loans and Grant program to provide additional funding

to improve its aged water system.

This project will add storage capacity, replace the distribution system, install new meters, improve the treatment plant, and put in a backup generator.

The current system lacks capacity and is unable to meet maximum daily demands and volume requirements.

Once completed, the project will protect water services, comply with water standards, and promote the health and safety of residents,

businesses, and visitors to this rural Fremont County community.

The City of Allerton received a \$27,000 grant through the Special Evaluation Assistance for Rural Communities and Households program to help complete a preliminary engineering report prepared by professional engineers to address wastewater system needs.

The City of Lake City received a \$4,804,000 loan through the Water and Waste Disposal Loan and Grant program to improve its wastewater

system.
